Monday, June 21, 2010 Aberdeen IronBirds (2-1) vs. Brooklyn Cyclones (2-1) Game #4, Home Game #2 (1-0)

TODAY'S STARTER: Righthander **Wes Wrenn** (0-0, 0.00 ERA) makes his first appearance of the season for the Cyclones.

Wes also pitched for the Cyclones in 2009, going 2-1 with a 4.15 ERA in 13 games (seven starts). In 47.2 innings in 2009, Wrenn allowed 56 hits, 23 runs, 22 earned, six home runs, and eight walks, while Istriking out 41 batters. Opponents hit .287 against Wrenn in '09, and he finished the season with a 1.34 WHIP.

Wes was 2-1 with a 4.19 ERA in seven games (34.1 IP) as a starter, and 0-0 with one save, one hold, and a 4.05 ERA in six games (13.1 IP) out of the bullpen.

On 8/16/09 vs. ONT, Wrenn tossed a season-high 7.0 innings, allowing one run on four hits and tying his season-best with six strikeouts.

Wrenn (5'11", 186) was selected by the Mets in the 35th round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft, out of The Citadel (SC). Wrenn was named the 2009 Southern Conference Pitcher of the Year. He earned All-America Honorable Mention accolades from Ping! Baseball, and was named to the All-Southern Conference First Team by both the coaches and the media.

Wes set school records in games started (59) and innings pitched (391.0) while finishing his career ranked third in school history in wins (26). He went 9-3 with a 3.62 ERA, and earned wins in six consecutive starts. Wrenn finished the 2009 season ranked 23rd in the nation in victories.

LAST GAME: The Cyclones fell to the Yankees by the score of 2-1 in a pitcher's duel at Staten Island on Sunday. In his third career start for Brooklyn, LHP **Angel Cuan** baffled the Yankee hitters over six innings, allowing only one run on five hits and no walks.

Brooklyn trailed 1-0 in the early going, but came from behind for the third straight night to tie the game in the sixth inning. After a season-high five errors in Saturday night's loss at MCU Park, the Yankees committed another costly misstep that allowed Brooklyn to even things up. With SS Luis Nieves on second with only the second hit for the Cyclones, 19-year-old CF Darrell Ceciliani smacked a hard grounder back to the pitcher. Nieves rounded too far past third on the pitcher's throw to first, but the first baseman's throw across the diamond sailed off target and Nieves trotted home, scoring the tying run.

The run proved to be the only one of the night for Brooklyn, as the Cyclones mustered only two hits off Yankee pitching all game. RHP **A.J Pinera** (0-1) took the loss, allowing the go-ahead run on a double off the right field wall in the seventh inning.

PACKED HOUSE: On Saturday, Brooklyn established a new Opening Day attendance record, with 9,888 fans filling the newly named MCU Park. Brooklyn's all-time high attendance came on 9/7/07, when the team drew 10,073 fans.

The Cyclones have led the New York-Penn League, and the entire Short-Season classification, in attendance in each of the franchise's first nine seasons. This season, the Cyclones are again leading the NYPL.

Brooklyn is the only Short-Season team ever to draw 300,000 fans in a single season, doing so in 2002 (317,124) and 2003 (307,383). The Cyclones are also the only Short-Season team ever to rank in minor league baseball's Top 15 in average attendance, doing so in each of its first eight seasons, and cracking the Top 10 in 2002 and 2003. Entering the 2010 season, 2,607,552 fans had attended regular-season Cyclones games.

CECILIANI: 19-year-old centerfielder **Darrell Ceciliani** has been one of the Cyclones' top performers through the first three games of the season, hitting second in the Brooklyn lineup. On Friday, Ceciliani went 2-for-5 with two runs scored, a double, an RBI bunt single, and a stolen base. On Saturday, he again went 2-for-5, scored one run, and drove in two. That night, he also made a spectacular, game-saving catch sliding at the base of the left-centerfield wall. On Sunday, he did not have a hit, but reached on an error in the only play of the game that scored a Brooklyn run.

Ceciliani, who turns 20 years old tomorrow, has drawn the praise of another number-two-hitting Oregon native -- manager Wally Backman. "Ceciliani is still just a baby, but

he's one of the players we're counting on to set the tone for our team and make things happen. He is learning how to hit second -- how to take pitches, when to bunt, when to steal bases...all the little things. He's fast, he makes good contact, he's got some pop, and he plays good defense. He's a prospect."
