TONIGHT'S STARTER: RHP **Scott Shaw** (1-0, 1.29) makes his fourth start of the season for the Cyclones, and his fifth appearance. In his last outing, Shaw allowed just one run on five hits in 5.1 innings in an eventual 6-1 extra-inning Brooklyn loss.

Shaw was selected by the Mets in the 13th round of this year's June draft, out of the University of Illinois (IL).

Shaw (6'5", 225) went 4-4 with a 7.83 ERA for the Illini in 2008, making 11 starts and tossing two complete games. He struck out 48 batters in 56.1 innings and walked only 24 batters, which ranked seventh in the Big Ten. In conference games, he gave up only 38 hits, which ranked third.

Scott also earned seven varsity letters at Warren Township High school, three in baseball, three in golf and one in basketball. He was named to the All-Area baseball team in 2003 and 2004, and was named to the All-North Suburban Conference baseball team in 2003 and 2004. Scott was also named to the All-NSC golf team in 2002 and 2003.

In addition, he helped lead the summer Warren baseball team to the state finals in 2002. Shaw also played for the Waterloo Bucks in the Northwoods League, and was named a mid-season all-star in 2007.

LAST GAME: Brooklyn fell to Jamestown 3-2 on Friday. The offense managed just four hits for the second straight night, with 1B **lke Davis** notching two hits, while DH **Reese Havens** and 3B **Zach Lutz** had one hit each. Davis' hit extends his hitting streak to 15 games -- at least one hit in every game in which he's played. In the top of the sixth, Brooklyn plated its only runs when Havens walked, Lutz and Davis singled, and OF **Seth Williams** followed with a sacrifice fly. In the bottom of the seventh, though, Jamestown came back to score three runs and take the lead.

Cyclones starter **Jeff Kaplan** tossed five scoreless innings, allowing four hits and striking out five. **Matias Carrillo** came on in relief, but allowed two of the runs in the seventh, while **Brandon Moore** allowed the third and was charged with the loss. **Jimmy Johnson** held the Jammers scoreless over the final 1.2 innings, but the Cyclones could not muster a comeback.

IKE STRIKES: 1B **Ike Davis** has at least one hit in every game in which he's played, a streak of 15 games, tying the second-longest streak in club history (Joe Jiannetti, 2002). Davis was the Mets' first pick of the first round in the June draft, 18th overall, out of Arizona State University.

1B/OF Lucas Duda set the franchise record last season with a 17-game hitting streak.

EXTRA INNINGS: Brooklyn has played three extra-inning games this season, going 1-2 in those contests. The Cycones entered the season 35-29 all-time in extra-inning games, and went 5-2 in 2007.

PACKING THE PARK: The Cyclones have led the NYPL -- and the entire Short-Season classification -- in attendance in each of the team's first seven years of existence. Brooklyn is again leading the league in 2008, with **79,041** fans in 11 openings, for an average of **7,186**.

In 2007 the Cyclones drew 294,972 fans in 36 openings, for an average of 8,194 fans per game (up from 7,820 in 2007). The team topped 9,000 fans on six separate occasions, and set a new all-time high with 10,073 fans on 9/7/07 vs. Lowell.

MOMENT OF SILENCE: The Cyclones will hold a moment of silence prior to today's game for Luz Portobanco who pitched for the team in 2001 and 2002. The 28-year-old Portobanco was killed in a car accident in his native Nicaragua last weekend.

Portobanco started the first game in franchise history (June 19th at Jamestown) and was a key member of the pitching staff for the inaugural-season 2001 NYPL champion Cyclones. "Porto" went 5-3 with a 2.04 ERA in 2001, and he saved his best for the biggest games. He also set the tone for a burgeoning rivalry by going 3-0 with a 0.53 ERA and 14 strikeouts in three dominant games against the Staten Island Yankees.

ANGEL'S RETURN: Mets OF **Angel Pagan** begins a rehab assignment with Brooklyn tonight. Pagan was an All-Star for the Cyclones in 2001, playing centerfield and batting from the leadoff spot. That season, Pagan hit .315 (75-for-238) in 62 games, with 46 runs, 10 doubles, two triples, and 15 RBI, while stealing a franchise-record 30 bases.

Pagan is expected to play the outfield for the Cyclones on Saturday, as he makes his way back to the majors after injuring his shoulder making a spectacular over-the-wall catch against the Dodgers on May 7th in Los Angeles. Pagan drove his shoulder into a folding seat after flipping over a cement wall along the third-base line while catching a pop-up by Andre Ethier. Pagan held on to the ball and stayed in the game for another inning before aggravating the injury on a slide into second base in the third.

Prior to his injury, Pagan was hitting .275 (25-for-91) in 31 games, with 12 runs, seven doubles, one triple, and 13 RBI.

ON THE MOUND: Cyclones pitchers rank second in the league with a 2.89 team ERA, behind only Staten Island's 2.47. Brooklyn hurlers lead the NYPL with 228 strikeouts.

In total, Cyclones pitchers have thrown 214.2 innings, and allowed 180 hits, 82 runs, 69 earned, and 103 walks. The staff has allowed 11 home runs.
