LAST GAME: The Cyclones defeated the Hudson Valley Renegades on Thursday night by the score of 6-1 at Dutchess Stadium...Brooklyn had 10 hits, including five doubles, matching their total number of hits for their previous four games...SS **Colby Woodmansee** went 3-for-5 as BKLYN scored two runs on errors and two runs on a wild pitch.

HE'S PETE-ING UP: The Cyclones are 11-0 when 1B **Pete Alonso** has an RBI..Alonso is now batting .423 (11-26) with RISP and .471 (8-17) with RISP and two outs...The former Florida Gator has 13 hits on the road, eight of which have gone for extra bases.

NEED FOR SPEED: OF **Jacob Zanon** currently leads the New York-Penn League in stolen bases with 20...Zanon has 19 consecutive stolen bases without being caught dating to June 24th...The 20 stolen bases are the most by a Cyclone since 2010 when OF Darrell Ceciliani stole 21 bags.

FABULOUS FIVE: Over their last five games, Brooklyn pitchers have allowed just four runs over 45.0 innings on the mound (0.80 ERA).

100 WINNING WAYS: Cyclones Manager **Tom Gamboa** comes into tonight's game with 99 wins as manager of the Cyclones...He would become just the third manager in franchise history to eclipse the 100 win mark, joining **Edgar Alfonzo** (146 wins) and **Rich Donnelly** (128 wins).

START ME UP: Over their last six games, Brooklyn Cyclones starting pitchers have allowed just two earned run over 37.2 IP for a 0.48 ERA... Dating to July 24th, Brooklyn starters have a 1.04 ERA (8 ER / 69.0), spanning 12 games.

vs. HUDSON VALLEY: The Cyclones lead the all-time series against the Renegades 92-68... Brooklyn has lost only one season series to the Renegades (2010)...Brooklyn is 52-29 all-time at MCU Park against the 'Gades and are 40-39 on the road...The 92 wins against the Renegades are the second most in franchise history, behind the 103 wins Brooklyn has against Staten Island.

ROAD SWEET ROAD: The Cyclones are 12-9 on the road this season and have score 90 runs in these 17 games as opposed to a 12-13 mark at home, scoring 74 runs in 25 games...The Cyclones are 10-4 in road games since July 1st.

TAKING OFFENSE: The Cyclones rank 13th in the NYPL with a .211 (325-1541) team average...The only team in all of MiLB with a lower team average is Batavia who is hitting .207 (310-1501)...Since 2001, no NYPL team has ever hit below .208 (Vermont '01)

BROOKLYN BACKSTOPS: Cyclones C **Ali Sanchez** is 0-for-12 over his last four games and is batting just .100 (4-40) dating to July 17th...C **Dan Rizzie** is 0 for his last 16, is 1-for-28 dating July 16th and is just 4-for-45 since July 1st.

O-JAS: OF **Hengelbert Rojas** is 0-for-20 and does not have a hit in one calendar month...Rojas started the season with hits in six of his first nine games, and is hitless over his last eight games with an AB.

DEFENSE NEVER RESTS: The Cyclones rank 2nd in the NYPL with a .978 fielding percentage...Brooklyn has 40 errors in 1,717 total chances...SS **Colby Woodmansee** leads all NYPL shortstops with a .987 fielding percentage.

VS. HUDSON VALLEY : Made two relief appearances against the Renegades, including one at Dutchess Stadium on July 17th at Hudson Valley....Has tossed 4.0 innings against Hudson Valley, scattering five hits and allowing one run while striking out four.

YA DUNN GOOD: RHP **Justin Dunn** is the highest drafted pitcher to appear for Brooklyn since LHP **Scott Kazmir** made five starts with BKLYN in 2002..The southpaw went 0-1 with a 0.50 ERA, allowing just five hits in 18.0 IP while striking out 34...Kazmir was 15th overall in the 2002 draft.

LAST OUTING: Got the loss after allowing four runs, all unearned, on five hits on July 30th at Vermont.

TRIPLE PLAY: Was on the mount in the top of the eighth on July 10th vs. Hudson Valley when Brooklyn turned the first triple play in franchise history. (2-6-4).

SOARING EAGLE: Went 4-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 18 games, 8 starts with Boston College this season...Struck out 72 batters in 65.2 innings on the mound...Was named 3rd Team All-America following the season.

START TO FINISH: Began the season as the closer for BC, before transitioning to the starting rotation...Went 3-1 as a starter in 2016.
