LAST GAME: Staten Island's **Junior Soto** hit a go-ahead, tie-breaking home run against Cyclones reliever **Billy Oxford** in the bottom of the eighth to send Staten Island to a 3-2 series-opening victory... **Carlos Cortes**, the Mets' 2018 3rd-round draft selection out of South Carolina, had three of Brooklyn's four hits.

BATTLE FOR THE NAILBITERS: With Saturday's win, the Yankees have won four of seven contests against Brooklyn in this year's "Battle for the Bridge"...Five of the seven games have been decided by three runs or fewer.

LIMIT THE LONG BALL: The Cyclones have allowed 11 home runs this season (T-3rd-most in the NYPL), with six coming in the past seven games...The past four home runs, and five of the previous six, have allowed the opponent to tie or take the lead.

WHO'S HOT?: After starting his pro career batting .063 (1-16), OF **David Miranda** is batting .429 (6-14) over his last six games....C **Nick Meyer** went 0-for-4 in his pro debut but has since compiled a seven-game hitting streak...Meyer is batting .393 (11-28) with four multi-hit games over that stretch.

WHO'S NOT?: INF **Jose Brizuela** is 7-for-36 (.194) over his last nine games...OF **Wagner Lagrange** is 7-for-36 (.194) over his last 10 games.

GET AHEAD: The Cyclones have scored the first run of the game in 14 of 22 games this season...Brooklyn is 9-5 in those games.

THE LONELIEST NUMBER: Brooklyn has been limited to one run on six different occasions this season, including five times at MCU Park...Dating back to June 24th, Brooklyn has scored a total of 15 runs in eight home games and has gone 2-6 in these contests.

vs. STATEN ISLAND: The Cyclones are 113-111 all-time against the Yankees, including 3-4 so far this season...Brooklyn has more wins against Staten Island than any other team in the NYPL...The Cyclones are 60-53 at MCU Park against the Yankees...Brooklyn has not won the season series over the Baby Bombers since 2014 when they went 8-6.

TWO-OUT TROUBLE: Brooklyn has allowed 101 runs this season, with 44 of them coming with two outs (43.5%).

FREE RUNS: In seven July games, Cyclones pitchers have issued 20 walks and hit 7 batters...14 of those 27 runners (52%) have come around to score.

LEAVE 'EM HANGING: Brooklyn has left 166 runners on base this season, third-most in the NYPL behind State College (176) and Vermont (172)...As a team, Brooklyn is batting .278 (102-367) with runners on base...1B **Chase Chambers** is hitting a whopping .371 (13-35) with runners on base and .421 (8-19) with runners in scoring position.

HIT THE SKIDS: After starting the season 8-2, Brooklyn has gone 3-9 and has been outscored 71-46 in these games...The Cyclones won their first four series of the season but have since lost their last three.

SUNDAY IS THURSDAY: New York Mets pitcher **Noah Syndergaard** will be the starting pitcher for the Cyclones today...Every fan in attendance will receive a Syndergaard as Thor T-shirt courtesy of Marvel.

WAITING IN THE WINGS: LHP **Kevin Smith** (7th/2018, Georgia) is set to pitch after Noah Syndergaard...Smith has made three appearances (one start), posting six scoreless innings.

How Obtained: Trade with Toronto (12/17/12), acquired with C John Buck, C Travis D'Arnaud and OF Wilmer Becerra in exchange for RHP R.A. Dickey, C Mike Nickeas, and C Josh Thole

REHAB ROAD: New York Mets placed RHP Noah Syndergaard on the 10-day disabled list retroactive to May 26 with a strained ligament in right index finger.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: At the time of his injury, Syndergaard ranked in the top 10 in the National League in strikeouts (76, fifth), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (10.6, eighth), walks per 9.0 innings (1.81, seventh), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.85 SO/BB, fifth) and winning percentage (.800, t-fifth).

IN GOOD COMPANY: Among active pitchers with at least 61 career starts, Syndergaard's 2.92 ERA (139 earned runs/428.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.38 career ERA and staffmate Jacob deGrom's 2.80 career ERA...Syndergaard is one of only five active major league hurlers with at least 60 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...Ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.40 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.77) and Max Scherzer (5.79).

..AND ALL BY HIMSELF: He is the only pitcher in major league history to record a SO/BB ratio of at least 5.0 in each of his first three major league seasons...Posted a 5.4 SO/BB ratio in his rookie campaign, a 5.1 mark in 2016 and fanned 11.3 batters per walk issued last season.

BACK TO BROOKLYN: Pitched with the Cyclones in the season finale on September 7, 2017 against Staten Island...Tossed two innings of three-run ball, striking out two and walking two.

QUICK FACTS: 2016 MLB All-Star, his first such selection but did not pitch due to arm fatigue...Became the second-youngest Mets pitcher to win a World Series game, beating Kansas City in Game 3 of the 2015 World Series with six innings of three-run ball, striking out six...Went on the 60-Day Disabled List, May 1-September 23, 2017 with a partial tear in his right lat...Drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays 38th overall in the 2010 MLB Draft.

- Monday night, Billy Oxford, Ryan Selmer, and Yeudy Colon combined for 5.1 scoreless innings, the bullpen's first scoreless outing in seven games. The last time Cyclones relievers didn't allow a run was in a 1-0 shutout win over Lowell on Sunday, June 24.
- LHP Kevin Smith has fired six scoreless innings over his first three professional appearances, including Tuesday's start.
- RHP Mac Lozer snapped his 7.1 IP scoreless streak to start the season Sunday vs. Staten Island, allowing a two-run home run to Andres Chaparro.
- RHP Yeudy Colon has a team-low 0.93 ERA, having allowed one run over 9.2 IP. Colon is in the midst of a 6.2 scoreless-innings streak.
