LAST GAME: Brooklyn rallied from an early 4-0 deficit to run away with an 11-4 win over the Staten Island Yankees on Sunday afternoon across the bridge...1B **Joe Genord** went 2-for-5 with a home run and six RBI to pace the Brooklyn bats...3B **Jose Peroza** added a 3-for-4 effort with four RBI.

HE'S HEATING UP: OF **Jake Mangum** has hit safely in 13 of his last 14 games and is batting .333 (16-48) over the span...Since July 27th, he has also stolen six bases and has a .418 on-base percentage...His lone game without a hit over the span was a pinch-hitting appearance on August 4th.

REYES IS RAKING: Since June 28th, INF **Wilmer Reyes** is batting .356 (48-135) with 19 runs scored and 21 RBI in the 35 games over this span...Reyes went 0-4 yesterday, just his fourth game without a hit over this stretch...He has not had consecutive hitless games in these 35 games.

RISP IT FOR THE BISCUIT: Brooklyn is first in the New York-Penn League with a .281 (128-455) batting average with runners in scoring position...Hudson Valley ranks second (.266)...Brooklyn is batting .270 with RISP and two outs, second-best in the league behind West Virginia. (.273).

SKIN OF THEIR TEETH: Brooklyn is 14-11 in one-run games this season...Through 55 games, 25 have been decided by a single run...Six of Brooklyn's last nine games have been decided by one run...Brooklyn won 19 games by one run in 2003, the most one-run wins in one season in franchise history.

TWANNY GOES FOR A WALK: Antoine Duplantix managed just three walks in his first 156 plate appearances, but has worked four walks over the last two games, with a pair on walks on Saturday and Sunday

vs. STATEN ISLAND: Brooklyn is 119-116 all-time against Staten Island...This is the 236th meeting in "The Battle for the Bridge," the most games the Cyclones have played against any team in franchise history...Brooklyn swept two from Staten Island to open 2019, but Staten Island swept a three-game set the next weekend...Brooklyn hasn't won the season series with the Baby Bombers since 2014.

PITCHING IN: Brooklyn pitchers currently lead the New York-Penn League, having allowed just 334 hits in 465.2 innings this season...They have allowed 25 fewer base knocks than any other team in the league (Aberdeen, 359)...Opponents are hitting a league-worst .200 (334-1,671) against the Cyclones.

JOEY G: 1B **Joe Genord** went 2-for-5 with a home run and six RBI on Sunday afternoon...Genord had six RBI in his previous 24 games and had no RBI in the nine games prior to yesterday's breakout...Genord currently ranks fifth in the NYPL with seven home runs and 31 RBI on the season.

THE COUNTDOWN: Cyclones manager **Edgardo Alfonzo** currently has 95 wins as manager of the Cyclones...Fonzie is hoping to become the fourth manager in franchise history to eclipse the 100 -win plateau, joining his brother **Edgar Alfonzo** (146), **Rich Donnelly** (128), and **Tom Gamboa** (112).

ALL-STAR STAFF: Cyclones manager **Edgardo Alfonzo**, hitting coach **Delwyn Young**, pitching coach **Josue Matos**, coach **Endy Chavez** and athletic trainer **Vanessa Weisbach** will be the coaching staff for one of the teams at next weeks New York-Penn League All-Star game to be played at Richmond County Bank Ballpark...The rosters for the game are expected to be announced later today or tomorrow.

THIS SEASON: Broke camp with the Double-A Binghamton Rumble Ponies of the Eastern League, pitching eight times as a starter...Went 3-5 with a 5.06 ERA over 37.1 innings.

COLLEGE YEARS: Attended Wheaton College in Norton, Massachusetts, going undrafted in 2014...Signed with the Mets in August of 2014 (the summer going into his senior year of college) after pitching in the Futures Collegiate Baseball League for the Torrington Titans in Connecticut.

WHAT'S UP WITH WHEATON: Chris Denorfia, who played for Cincinnati, Oakland, San Diego, Seattle, and the Chicago Cubs is the only Wheaton Lion to make it to the Major Leagues, getting drafted in the 19th round in 2002...Gibbons is the only current player in professional baseball right now.
