YESTERDAY: Brooklyn shut out Connecticut for 14 innings, sweeping a doubleheader from the Tigers with 4-0 and 5-0 wins on Friday night at Dodd Stadium...In Game 2, **Dan Goggin**, **Hunter Parsons**, and **Jared Biddy** totaled 14 strikeouts, one off the team's season high...INF **Wilmer Reyes** hit his fifth home run in the first inning of Game 1...OF **Ranfy Adon** went 3-3 with a RBI and a run in Game 2.

CENTURY CLUB: With Brooklyn's win in Game 1 last night, **Edgardo Alfonzo** won his 100th game as the manager of the Cyclones...Fonzie became the fourth manager in franchise history to eclipse the 100-win mark...He now ranks fourth all-time with 101 career Cyclones wins, trailing his brother **Edgar Alfonzo** (146), **Rich Donnelly** (128), and **Tom Gamboa** (112).

SHUTOUT SQUARED: Brooklyn pitching spun a pair of shutouts in last night's doubleheader, the first time in 12 years that the Cyclones posted two shutout wins in one day...On August 8, 2007, the Cyclones won two games, both by a 2-0 score, at Mahoning Valley...1B **Lucas Duda** batted clean-up for Brooklyn in both games and hit a home run in the first game...RHP **Eddie Kunz**, who pitched briefly for the Mets in 2008, earned the Game 1 save.

PITCH PERFECT: The Cyclones' pitching staff has allowed just one run in 19 innings in this series for a team ERA of 0.47...Brooklyn has posted shutouts in three of the last four games after recording only two shutouts in the first 61 contests of the season.

THE SQUIRREL WAS A CYCLONE: New York Mets INF/OF **Jeff McNeil** played for Brooklyn in Game 1 yesterday as part of his rehab from a strained left hamstring...The 2019 NL All-Star and batting leader went 1-4 with an infield single and a run scored...McNeil started the first four innings in right field before playing the final three innings at third.

vs. CONNECTICUT: The Cyclones are 36-28 against the Connecticut Tigers since they joined the NYPL in 2010...Brooklyn is 5-3 against the Tigers this season, including 3-2 at Dodd Stadium...Brooklyn went 8-1 against Connecticut last season and is 6-3 at Dodd Stadium since 2017...The Cyclones were 22-13 against the Oneonta Tigers before they moved to Norwich.

DOUBLE, NO TROUBLE: The Cyclones have swept two doubleheaders in less than a week...Brooklyn took two from Tri-City at home on Sunday with 2-1 and 5-3 wins...Brooklyn is now 5-3 in twinbills.

RISP, REWARD: Brooklyn leads the NYPL with a .271 (147-543) average with RISP...C **Jose Mena** leads the team with a .500 average (10-20) with RISP.

WIN SOME, LOSE SOME: The Cyclones are 3-8 in their last 11 road games...Brooklyn is 9-1 in their last 10 home games over that same stretch.

DON'T WALK: The Cyclones rank last in the NYPL with just 171 walks, 95 behind the league-leading West Virginia Black Bears (266)...There are 10 teams in the NYPL with at least 40 more walks than the Cyclones...INF **Luke Ritter** is tied for fourth in the league with 31 walks...No other player on the team has more than 17 walks (Yoel Romero).

THE SINGLE LIFE: Brooklyn is seventh in the New York-Penn League with 495 hits on the year, but 74% of their hits have been singles...Brooklyn ranks 13th in the NYPL with 81 doubles.

RACE TO THE FINISH: The Cyclones enter Saturday's game tied with Aberdeen for 1st place in the Wild Card, with West Virginia one game back and Staten Island two games back...Brooklyn is tied for second in the McNamara Division and trails Hudson Valley by one game.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: His last time out, worked three innings for the first time as a pro...The outing prior at Vermont, allowed his first hits, runs, and home run as a pro, taking his first pro loss.

HE'S BAAAACK: Missed a month and a half with illness... Made his first pro start on June 17 against Aberdeen (4th game of the season), but didn't pitch again until Saturday, August 3 at Williamsport (47th game of the season).

FIRST IN LINE: Was the first 2019 Mets draft selection to make a pro start for Brooklyn when he pitched against Aberdeen on June 17.

NORTHWESTERN STATE: Second-highest draft selection out of Northwestern State University in Louisiana...Highest pick since Mason Melotakis (2nd, 2012) by Minnesota.

STRAIGHT OUTTA THE SOUTHLAND: Earned Second Team All-Southland honors in 2019, going 7-4 with a 2.78 ERA...Finished top 10 in the Southland Conference in eight categories, including wins (7), Ks (80), and opponents' average (.209)...Only Southland pitcher to throw multiple complete-game shutouts in 2019, doing so in back-to-back starts.

SISTER, SISTER: Jones has five siblings, including a sister named Brooklyn.
