LAST NIGHT: Playing as the Marble Rye in front of a sold-out Seinfeld Night crowd, Brooklyn scored early and never looked back, beating West Virginia 3-1 in Saturday's series opener...OF **Ranfy Adon** had a career night, going 4-for-4 with a double and 2 RBI...Brooklyn pitching combined for a season-high 15 strikeouts.

AWESOME ADON: OF **Ranfy Adon** collected the first four-hit game of his career last night, including a double and two RBI...The Dominican-born outfielder is on a five-game hitting streak, going 10-19 (.526) with 4 XBH, 4 RBI, and 5 runs.

FRY-MAN ON FIRE: INF **Branden Fryman** has raked over his first ten games with the Cyclones... The 20th-round pick of the Mets from Samford, and their only college junior selection, has gone 15-37 (.405) with two doubles, four RBI, and four stolen bases...He has four multi-hit games, including a four-hit game against Mahoning Valley on Wednesday.

PITCH PERFECT: Cyclones pitchers **Alec Kisena**, **Dan Goggin**, **PJ Conlon**, and **Matt Mullenbach** combined to punch out 15 batters last night, Brooklyn's most in a game this season...Over the homestand, Cyclones pitching has posted a 1.41 ERA with 37 strikeouts in 32 innings (10.4 K/9)...The Cyclones recorded their first shutout of the season Wednesday against Mahoning Valley, the first game of the six-game homestand.

MOST RECENT REHABBER: Irish-born LHP **P.J. Conlon** made a rehab outing last night, throwing two no-hit innings of relief with two walks and two strikeouts...Conlon is down from Triple-A Syracuse to rehab a strained flexor in his throwing arm...He is the ninth player to rehab with Brooklyn this season and the fifth pitcher with MLB experience (Familia, Oswalt, Syndergaard, Wilson).

vs. WEST VIRGINIA: The Cyclones are 6-7 all-time against the Black Bears, the affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, since West Virginia entered the league, moving the franchise from Jamestown to Morgantown in 2015...This series marks the second time West Virginia makes a trip to MCU Park and the first since 2016, when the Black Bears beat the Cyclones in two of three games.

SO YOU'RE ON THE SPEED DIAL?: The Cyclones have stolen 21 bases in 28 attempts during the month of July, 2nd-most in the New York-Penn League...Brooklyn stole just eight in June, but **Branden Fryman** and **Guillermo Granadillo** have run rampant this month, stealing four bases each.

INJURED INFELDERS: INF **Yoel Romero** left Tuesday's game with a lower-body injury and is considered day-to-day...Romero maintains a 12-game hitting streak and ranks second in the NYPL in batting average (.321)...INF **Angel Manzanarez** is considered day-to-day after being hit on the forehead by a pitch on Friday against Mahoning Valley...Manzanarez received seven stitches.

DIRTY DOZEN: INF **Yoel Romero** currently has a 12-game hitting streak, tied for the longest streak in the NYPL this season....Romero's streak is the 20th streak of 12 or more in franchise history and the longest since Walter Rasquin hit in 14 straight games during the 2017 season...The franchise record is 17 games by **Lucas Duda** from August 16, 2007 - September 2, 2007.

DON'T CROSS THE STREAMS: The Cyclones are the first - and only - team in Minor League Baseball streaming games through Facebook Live this season...Brooklyn will stream all 38 home games exclusively through Facebook Live as part of a partnership with Sling Studio...All other MiLB teams that offer streaming must use MiLB TV.

LAST TIME OUT: Worked through five innings for the third straight start, but took the loss on Monday at Tri-City...Allowed four runs on four hits, with a season-low one walk and a season-high four strikeouts...Gave up three of those runs on a three-run homer.

2018 SEASON: Pitched with Kingsport (R) last season, working as a starting pitcher...Went 1-4 with a 4.97 ERA over 10 starts, walking 40 batters and striking out just 26.

SEASON FOUR: The tall right-hander pitched in the GCL for his first two seasons before making the jump to the Appalachian League with Kingsport last season.

WALKS GON' KILL YA: Cleveland has struggled with walks throughout his career...Has walked 71 in 96.1 innings, while striking out just 56 for a walk rate of 16 percent...Walked at least five batters in four of 10 starts last year with the K-Mets.

WINDSOR TIES TO BROOKLYN: Cleveland is the second professional player from Windsor, joining Dick Teed...Teed played 17 seasons in the pros, making one appearance in the Major Leagues...Teed pinch hit in one game for the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1953, striking out against the Milwaukee Braves on July 24...He was sent down, playing 10 more seasons in the minors without earning another call-up.

FARM FAMILY: Played for head coach Joe Serfass at Windsor High School...Serfass played in the Mets farm system from 2004-2007, reaching as high as Double-A Binghamton, but never played for the Cyclones.
