YESTERDAY: Aberdeen handed the Cyclones a 5-4 loss en route to a sweep...Brooklyn suffered a three-game sweep for the second time this season...3B **Yoel Romero** extended his hitting streak to nine games with a two-run home run, while RHP **Mitch Ragan** pushed his scoreless streak to eight innings with 2.1 IP of relief.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Brooklyn heads upstate to face the Tri-City ValleyCats for the 10th away game of the season...The Cyclones are 6-3 on the road this season and just 4-7 at home, winning series at Hudson Valley (2-1) and Aberdeen (3-0) and splitting two games at Lowell...Brooklyn has not had a winning record on the road since 2012 when the team finished 24-14 en route to a 45-31 record and an NYPL Wild Card appearance.

JOEY BATS: 1B **Joe Genord** currently ranks sixth in the NYPL in batting (.318), leads the league in HR (5), is tied for the league lead in RBI (17), and leads the league in slugging (.636) and OPS (1.009)...Leads all Brooklyn qualified hitters in 10 different batting statistics...Has driven in 10 runs and has five extra-base hits over his last five games.

RED-HOT ROMERO: INF **Yoel Romero** has compiled a team-best nine-game hitting streak, going 13-for-34 (.382) with a double, two home runs, five RBIs, and five runs over this stretch...Romero ranks second on the team with 19 hits...His longest career hitting streak lasted 21 straight games, beginning in August 2017 and carrying into the 2018 season.

NAIL-BITING: The Cyclones have played 11 one-run games, going 8-3 in those contests...The Cyclones have been outscored by 16 runs this season...In wins, Brooklyn is +17 in run differential, but -34 in losses.

vs. TRI-CITY: The Cyclones are 49-47 all-time against Tri-City, but have gone 19-35 since 2011 after going 20-12 against the 'Cats from 2002-10... Brooklyn has not won a season series against Tri-City since 2010...The Cyclones went 1-2 at home and 2-4 at "The Joe" in 2018...Brooklyn owns a 25-20 record at MCU Park against the 'Cats and a 24-27 mark on the road in Troy.

AGGRESSIVE BY NATURE: Brooklyn ranks last in the league in walks, taking 50 over the first 21 games for a league-lowest .278 on-base percentage...Luke Ritter leads the team with nine free passes which is four more than the next closest, but ranks tied for 12th in the league.

ONE, TWO PUNCH: The Brooklyn Cyclones have recently added OF **Jake Mangum** and OF **Antoine Duplantis** to the roster...Mangum, who starred at Mississippi State, and Duplantis, who played for LSU, rank 1st and 2nd all-time in hits in the SEC...Mangum had 383 hits, while Duplantis tallied 359.

A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE: The Brooklyn Cyclones have thrown 31 wild pitches this season, most in the New York-Penn League...That includes 21 wild pitches with runners in scoring position, also tops in the league...Of those 21 wild pitches with RISP, nine have come with two outs.

DON'T CROSS THE STREAMS: The Cyclones will be the first - and only - team in Minor League Baseball who will stream games through Facebook Live this season...Brooklyn will stream all 38 home games exclusively through Facebook Live as part of a partnership with Sling Studio...All other MiLB teams that offer streaming must use MiLB TV.
