LAST NIGHT: The Cyclones won their fifth consecutive game, and their fifth straight one-run victory, coming back from five runs down to beat Lowell 8-7 Saturday night in the middle game of the series... Brooklyn's six-run sixth lifted the team to a win...**Joe Genord** homered and **Luke Ritter** tripled in a run.

WILSON WINDS: LHP **Justin Wilson** will pitch the first inning Sunday, rehabbing for the second time with Brooklyn...The Mets reliever has not pitched in a big league game since May 6 at San Diego... He last tossed one inning June 15 at Staten Island, working a scoreless frame.

VALENTINO A MET: RHP **Frank Valentino**, an alumnus of NYIT, was signed by the Mets this week and will come into pitch after Justin Wilson's opening inning...Grew up in West Islip, NY and rooted for Mike Piazza, David Wright, and John Franco among others...He was signed out of Frontier League, pitching with the Florence Freedom.

PROGRAMMING NOTE: Due to severe weather on Coney Island Saturday, yesterday's scheduled doubleheader has been rescheduled to Tuesday, July 30 at 6 p.m. when Lowell returns to Brooklyn for a three-day, four-game set.

LUKE HITTER: INF **Luke Ritter** went 5-6 Friay night to become the ninth player in franchise history to collect five hits in a game, and the first since INF **Nick Sergakis** had a five-hit game on June 20, 2016 vs. Tri City...Ritter is just the second Cyclone since 2011 to record five hits.

COME ONE, COME ALL: INF **Sam Haggerty** was received Thursday on rehab assignment from the Binghamton RumblePonies...Played 39 games before going on the shelf with a hamstring injury...Traded from Cleveland to the Mets in January, coming over with RHP **Walker Lockett** for C **Kevin Plawecki**.

vs. LOWELL: The Cyclones are 58-43 all-time against the Lowell Spinners, including 34-21 at MCU Park...Brooklyn went 5-2 against the Spinners last season and are 9-4 against Lowell at MCU Park over the last two seasons...Brooklyn and Lowell split a pair of games at LeLacheur Park earlier this season and had a third game rained out.

NAILBITING: The Cyclones have played eight one-run games, going 8-1 in those contests...The Cyclones have been outscored by 12 runs this season...In wins, Brooklyn is +11 in run differential, but -23 in losses.

NEW GUYS: RHP **Cole Gordon** was added to the Cyclones roster from the MLB Draft where he was selected in the 32nd round out of Mississippi State...The righthander went 5-1 with 11 saves and a 3.80 ERA in 30 games, all in relief...He struck out 69 batters and walked 24 in 42.2 innings...OF **Antoine Duplantis**, selected in the 12th round of the MLB Draft out of LSU, has also joined the team...Duplantis, the all-time hits leader at LSU, hit .324 (91-281) with 12 home runs and 68 RBI in 66 games with the Tigers in 2019.

JAKE AND THE BAT MAN: The New York Mets announced that they have signed 4th round selection OF **Jake Mangum** from Mississippi State...He is expected to join the Cyclones today...Mangum is the all-time hits leader in SEC history, and set the Mississippi State single season record for hits this year with 108.

DON'T CROSS THE STREAMS: The Cyclones will be the first - and only - team in Minor League Baseball who will stream games through Facebook Live this season...Brooklyn will stream all 38 home games exclusively through Facebook Live as part of a partnership with Sling Studio...All other MiLB teams that offer streaming must use MiLB TV.

FIRST TIME, LONG TIME: Making his first appearance in affiliated baseball...Grew up in West Islip, NY as a Mets fan and describes himself as a "diehard"...Considers Mike Piazza, David Wright, John Franco, Tom Glavine, and Pedro Martinez his favorite Mets players.

NEW FRONTIER: Had his contract purchased from the Frontier League's Florence Freedom in Florence, Ky. on June 27.

YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Was named a Frontier League All-Star on June 25, two days before the Mets purchased his contract...At the time of his signing, led the Frontier League with a 2.10 ERA...Led the Freedom with 49 strikeouts and seven quality starts (of eight total).

NO HELP: Posted a 4-3 record in eight starts with the Freedom despite averaging the least run support of the team's starters (3.5 runs per outing).

NYIT: Made 27 appearances (19 starts) over 2016 and 2017 at NYIT, recording a 5.60 ERA with 102 Ks in 125.1 IP (7.3 K/9) during NYIT's final seasons in Division 1.

FAMILIAR FREEDOM FACES: Becomes the fourth Freedom player since 2017 to have their contract purchased by the Mets...Joins infielder Jose Brizuella and pitchers Matt Poberyko and Marty Anderson...Brizuella played 28 games for Brooklyn last year, and Anderson made four outings for Brooklyn in 2017.
