LAST NIGHT: Brooklyn took the rubber game of a three-game series against the Auburn Doubledays by the score of 9-4...**Richard Lucas** went 4-4 and **Danny Muno** continued swinging a hot bat with a 3-3 effort while driving in a pair as Brooklyn pounded out 14 hits...**Carlos Vazquez** collected the win after retiring the first 11 batters he faced and allowing only one run through 5.0 innings of work.

CYCLONES VS. LOWELL: The Cyclones come into tonight's game with a record of 29-20 against the Lowell Spinners...The Cyclones went 5-1 against Lowell in 2010 including 3-0 at MCU Park.

AT THE GAME TONIGHT: The first 3,000 fans in attendance will receive a Brooklyn-to-Queens Baseball featuring a number of former Cyclones who have gone on to play for the Mets...In addition it is National Hot Dog Day and there will be 75 lucky fans who receive FREE Hot Dogs, drinks and fries from Nathans...Following the conclusion of the game, there will be post-game fireworks.

NEXT HOME GAME: Sunday's game is filled with entertainment from start to finish...It will be Jewish Heritage Night with a pre-game concert from children's singer Uncle Moishy...There will also be a pre-game catch on the field from 4:00-4:30...The first 3,000 fans in attendance will receive a Cyclones Power Bracelet...And following the game, all children are invited to come down to the field and run the bases.

THE NEED FOR SPEED: Brooklyn currently ranks last in the NYPL with only 11 stolen bases in 27 games...Vermont leads the league with 52 swipes and Lowell ranks second with 49...The Cyclones are on the only team in the league with less than 21 stolen bases.

WHO'S HOT: Since returning from the Disabled List **Danny Muno** has been on fire, hitting .458 (11-24) over his last seven games...He has reached base safely in 18 of his 31 plate appearances over this period...**Richard Lucas**, who went 4-4 last night, is hitting .343 (12-35) over his last nine games.

CHRIS HILLIARD: Will not make his scheduled start tomorrow due to an injury to his left elbow...**Randy Fontanez** will make his first professional start in his place.

LEAGUE LEADERS: **Brandon Brown** ranks eighth in the NYPL with a .316 (24-76) average...**Richard Lucas** is 10th in hitting at .315 (28-89)...**Eduardo Aldama** ranks ninth in the NYPL with a 1.93 ERA and leads the league in strikeouts with 37...**Javier Rodriguez** is tied for the league lead with 10 doubles and is second with 19 RBI...**Hunter Carnevale** is tied for the league lead with four holds.

COLE FRENZEL: Went 2-3 with a pair of runs scored and two RBI...The Mets 7th round pick in 2011 has five RBI in his last three games and has three multi-hit games in six starts for the cyclones.

PITCHING IN: The Cyclones lead the NYPL with a 2.70 ERA as a team...They have allowed only 90 runs in 240.1 innings, but 18 of the 90 (20%) have been unearned.

COUNTDOWN TO THREE MILLION: The Cyclones have welcomed 93,716 fans so far this year...With a grand total of 2,965,709 fans that have entered MCU Park since its inception in 2001, the Cyclones are just 34,291 fans shy of the 3,000,000 mark - reaching the milestone quicker than any Short Season franchise in the history of Minor League Baseball.

- Was the Mets 7th round selection in 2010 out of the University of Georgia.
- During his senior season with the Bulldogs went 2-6 in 18 games, 13 starts.
- Struck out 55 over 68.1 innings on the mound.
- Had a career-high eight strikeouts at #4 Florida on May 15, 2010 over 6.0 innings of work.
- Was also selected in the 17th round of the 2009 MLB Draft by the Baltimore Orioles but did not sign.
