PLAYOFFS: The Cyclones will be making their eighth appearance in the playoffs since the franchise began 11 seasons ago...This marks the first time in franchise history that the club has made the playoffs in three consecutive seasons...It also marks the third time that the Cyclones have made the playoffs as the NYPL's Wild Card (2006, 2009)...The team won the McNamara Division title in 2001, 2003, 2004, 2007 and 2010.

ON FIRE: The Cyclones come into the playoffs having won six straight games and 10 of their last 11 dating to August 25th...Over this span the Cyclones have outscored their opponents 56-26...Brooklyn has also won six of their last seven games against Staten Island dating back to August 5th.

CYCLONES VS. YANKEES: The Cyclones went 9-5 against Staten Island this season and are 73-67 overall against the Yankees during the regular season...The teams have also squared off three times in the playoffs...In 2001, Brooklyn defeated Staten Island two games to one, in 2006, SI swept the Cyclones and in 2007, Brooklyn returned the favor taking both games from SI.

2011 VS. YANKEES: Shortstop **Danny Muno** is batting .394 (13-33) in nine games against Staten Island...The Cyclones are 7-2 against the Baby Bombers with Muno in the lineup and 2-3 without him...Outfielder **Travis Taijeron** is batting .425 (17-40) with 10 RBI in 11 games against the Yankees...Cyclones reliever **T.J. Chism** did not allow a run in 7.1 innings against the Baby Bombers...Staten Island hit .257 (126-490) against Brooklyn pitching, while the Cyclones hit .285 (142-498)...Brooklyn outscored Staten Island 86-52 in their 14 games.

DAN THE MAN: Shortstop **Danny Muno** currently has a 13-game hitting streak, the longest by a Cyclone this season...Over the span, he is hitting .452 (19-42)...Since August 5th, he has hit safely in 23 of 25 games...Muno finished the season with a NYPL best .355 average.

MORE ON MUNO: **Danny Muno** finished third in the NYPL with 43 runs scored...Since July 31st, when Muno scores a run the Cyclones are 15-3...For the season, the team is 24-8 when he scores.

RICHARD IN GEAR: Cyclones third baseman **Richard Lucas** ended the season on a tear, hitting .450 (9-20) over his last five games while collecting six RBI...Lucas had been struggling previously, hitting just .143 (5-35) in his previous 11 contests.

DEFENSE NEVER RESTS: The Cyclones led the NYPL in fielding percentage (.972) and committed a league low 85 errors, 10 fewer than Staten Island and Jamestown, who ranked second...Brooklyn allowed 218 earned runs, the fewest in the league and walked only 192 -- 24 fewer than Connecticut, who ranked second.

THE MAGIC NUMBER: This season, when the Cyclones score five or more runs the team is 28-5...Conversely, when they score four runs or less the team is 17-24.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The 2011 Cyclones have outscored their opponents 214-130 from the fifth inning on...Brooklyn is 26-10 when they score the last run of the game.

COME AND SEE THE 'CLONES: For the 11th consecutive year, Brooklyn finished the regular season first in average attendance (7,002) and total attendance (245,087) in the NYPL.

THE BATTLE FOR THE BRIDGE: So far this season, the Cyclones and Yankees have drawn 106,779 fans in the 14 games between the clubs...In 2008, the two teams combined to draw a record 107,312 in 14 regular season games.

- Has never faced the Staten Island Yankees.
- Since July 29th has not allowed more than two earned runs in any of his six starts... Is 2-0 with a 1.39 (five earned runs / 32.1innings pitched) has walked five and struck out 36 over this span.
- Struck out a season-high eight batters in 4.2 innings of work on 8/17 vs. JAM.
- Has been at his best with runners in scoring position, limiting the opposition to a .216 (11-51) average...With two outs and RISP opponents are hitting just .211 (8-38).
- Lasted only 1.0 innings on July 13th vs. Auburn play was halted by over an hour due to rain.
- Has limited righthanders to a .235 (28-119) batting average against and lefthanders to a .266 (34-128) batting average against.
- Allowed all four home runs this season in two consecutive starts. Previous to 7/18/11, had not allowed a home run since 8/17/09 while with the DSL Mets (R).
